Aditya had to fight the system to adopt him. First hurdle was that the age of adoption for a single parent was 30 years at that time. He wrote letters to the concerned people, politicians and Bollywood stars and got the age of adoption reduced to 25 years. Mr. Aditya Tiwari has been awarded the world's best mom award.

Inequities in quality and safety outcomes for hospitalized children with intellectual disability LAUREL MIMMO, REEMA HARRISON, JOANNE TRAVAGLIA, NAN HU, SUSAN WOOLFENDEN Developmental Medicine & Child Neurology 2021 Accepted for publication 1st September 2021.

Abstract

AIM To investigate if there are inequities in quality and safety outcomes for children with intellectual disability admitted to two tertiary paediatric hospitals.

METHOD A cross-sectional study of 1367 admissions for 1018 randomly selected patients admitted for more than 23 hours to one of two tertiary children's hospitals in Sydney, Australia (1st January-31st December 2017). Electronic medical records were manually interrogated to identify children with intellectual disability (including developmental delay). Data extracted included patient demographics, length of stay, number of admissions, and reported clinical incidents.

RESULTS In total, 12.3% (n=125) of children admitted during the study period had intellectual disability, which represented 13.9% (n=190) of admissions. Sex and age at admission in children with and without intellectual disability were similar: 83 (43.7%) vs 507 (43.1%) females and 107 (56.3%) vs 670 (56.9%) males, p=0.875; median age 3 years (0–18y) vs 4 years (0–18y), p=0.122. Children with intellectual disability had significantly greater median length of stay (100.5h vs 79h, p<0.001) and cost of admission (A\$11 596.38 vs A\$8497.96) than their peers (p=0.001). Children with intellectual disability had more admissions with at least one incident compared to children without intellectual disability (14.7% vs 9.7%); this was not statistically significant (p=0.06).

INTERPRETATION Children with intellectual disability experience inequitable quality and safety outcomes in hospital. Engaging children and families in clinical incident reporting may enhance understanding of safety risks for children with intellectual disability in hospital.

Response to treatment and outcomes of infantile spasms in Down syndrome Susan Harvey, Sally A. Lynch, David Webb, Nicholas M. Allen, Mary D. King, Bryan Lynch, Mary O'Regan, Declan O'Rourke, Amre Shahwan, Kathleen M. Gorman, Irish Paediatric Neurology Group; Dev Med Child Neurol. 2022;00:1–9.

Abstract

Aim: To estimate the prevalence, and evaluate presentation, treatment response, treatment side effects, and long-term seizure outcomes in all known cases of children with Down syndrome and infantile spasms on the island of Ireland.

Method: This was a 10-year retrospective multicentre review of clinical records and investigations, focusing on treatment response, side effects, and long-term outcomes. Results: The prevalence of infantile spasms in Down syndrome was 3.0% during the study period. Fifty-four infants were identified with median age of spasm onset at 201 days (interquartile range [IQR] 156–242). Spasm cessation was achieved in 88% (n=46) at a median of 110 days (IQR 5–66). The most common first-line medications were prednisolone (n=20, 37%), vigabatrin (n=18, 33.3%), and sodium valproate (n=9, 16.7%). At follow-up (median age 23.7mo; IQR 13.4–40.6), 25% had ongoing seizures and 85% had developmental concerns. Treatment within 60 days did not correlate with spasm cessation. Seventeen children (31%) experienced medication side effects, with vigabatrin accounting for 52%.

Interpretation: Prednisolone is an effective and well-tolerated medication for treat- ing infantile spasms in Down syndrome. Despite the high percentage of spasm cessa- tion, developmental concerns and ongoing seizures were common.

Mini EDACS: Development of the Eating and Drinking Ability Classification System for young children with cerebral palsy

Abstract

Aim

To develop and test Mini-EDACS to describe developing eating and drinking abilities of children with cerebral palsy (CP) aged between 18 and 36 months.

Method

The existing Eating and Drinking Ability Classification System (EDACS) was modified to define Mini-EDACS content. Mini-EDACS was developed in three stages: (1) EDACS was modified after application to videos of standardized feeding evaluations of children with CP aged 18 to 36 months (n = 130); (2) refined content and validity of Mini-EDACS was established through an international Delphi survey; (3) interobserver reliability was assessed by comparing Mini-EDACS levels assigned by speech and language therapists (SaLTs) from video data and parent report.

Results

Mini-EDACS provides age-appropriate descriptions for children aged 18 to 36 months with CP. Eightynine stakeholders participated in the Delphi survey; required levels of agreement were met after one round (i.e. >80% agreement). Thirteen SaLTs completed paired ratings from 43 video recordings: absolute agreement was 58% (kappa 0.43; intraclass correlation coefficient 0.78; 95% confidence interval 0.63–0.87).

Interpretation

Mini-EDACS provides a valid system for classifying eating and drinking performance of children with CP under 3 years old. Results suggest moderate agreement and good reliability when rating Mini-EDACS levels from video recordings of young children with CP.
