Emotion dysregulation in children with autism: A multimethod investigation of the role of child and parent factors Annie S. Mills , Paula Tablon-Modica, Carla A. Mazefksy, Jonathan A. Weiss

Abstract

Background: Children with autism have been found to experience greater difficulties with emotion regulation than peers without autism. Characteristics related to autism (i.e., social communica- tion challenges, restricted repetitive behaviours, inhibitory control difficulties) and external parent factors (i.e., parent stress, mindful parenting) have been suggested to contribute to the emotion dysregulation (ED) experienced by youth with autism.

Method: The current study evaluated associations between child and parent factors and two indices of child ED (parent report and observational behaviour coding), in 44 children with autism, ages 8–13 years.

Results: Child autism symptomology, inhibitory control difficulties, parental stress and mindful parenting were all associated with parent reported ED, but not with observed ED. Similarly, linear regressions revealed that these factors jointly predicted parent reported ED, but not observed ED. Restricted interests/repetitive behaviours and inhibitory control difficulties emerged as unique positive predictors of parent reported ED.

Conclusions: Findings highlight the importance of using a multimethod approach and of consid- ering child- and parent-level factors when investigating ED in children with autism.

Utility of Diagnostic Classification for Children 0–5 to Assess Features of Autism: Comparing In person and COVID 19 Telehealth Evaluations Sara Julsrud Holtman, Katherine Skillestad Winans, John D. Hoch. Journal of Autism and Developmental Disorders

Abstract

Logistic regression was used to examine the use of Autism Spectrum diagnostic categories from pre-COVID-19 in-person evaluations and COVID-19 telehealth evaluations at a specialist community mental health clinic. The diagnostic classifi- cation for children 0–5 (DC: 0–5) affords a wider range of diagnoses that allowed for inferences of clinician certainty of diagnosis. Use of full criteria diagnoses was significantly lower from telehealth evaluations during the pandemic, and was less certain for younger children, some non-English speakers, and children reporting Native American/Alaska Native race. Higher Child Behavior Checklist (CBCL) ASD subscale scores, lower CBCL total scores, and global developmental delay diagnoses predicted greater use of full ASD diagnoses. Findings suggest factors that could identify children appropriate for telehealth evaluations.

- No other forms of submission like hard copies, fax etc. shall be accepted.
- □ The last date for submission of the abstracts is **31st** July 2022.
- The abstracts will be accepted as oral papers/poster paper depending on its merits. Case reports will be accepted as Posters ONLY. The Expert Committee will review the abstracts and decide the mode of presentation- poster or oral. The decision of the committee will be final in deciding the mode of presentation. Notification of acceptance of abstract submitted will be sent by e mail only to the presenting author on the e mail as given by the authors. Presentations: All presentations must be in English. Detailed instructions for poster/ oral paper presenters will be sent after the selection process is complete.
